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

Capital Improvement Report

Cloie Creek Trail - Midwest Concrete recently completed construction activity for a partially state funded trail that was constructed along Cloie Creek in two separate segments. One segment connects the east side of the Forest Hills Subdivision to the Hales Mill Lift Station, while the other segment connects Maple Hills Park to the Hales Mill Lift Station. Midwest Concrete completed the project for a little under \$725,000. The new trail provides connectivity within the community, as pedestrians can now utilize trails and sidewalks to walk from the Forest Hills subdivision to the Eastern limits of the City of Asbury.

Springreen Drive and Sunset Drive Reconstruction Project - This project was awarded to Eastern Iowa Excavating in the spring of 2022. The winning bid by Eastern Iowa Excavating came in at just under \$1.7 million. Construction has been ongoing since early April. The project includes water main replacement, storm sewer upgrades, street lighting, and total replacement of the existing roadway pavement with new concrete pavement. When complete, Springreen Drive will remain 37 feet wide and Sunset Drive will remain 31 feet wide. Construction is slated to be complete around September of 2022.

Hales Mill Road Reconstruction - The City is nearing the end of the design phase for the reconstruction of Hales Mill Road between Brick Mason Lane and Asbury Road. The project will be partially state funded, and will consist of improvements to the sanitary sewer system, storm sewer system, street lighting, and include new roadway pavement. The City plans to receive bids for the project in the fall of 2022, with construction slated to start in the spring of 2023.

Hidden Meadows Drive Overlay - Design is wrapping up for the asphalt overlay of Hidden Meadows Drive and Budd Road to the south of Asbury Road. The City is working with Dubuque County to complete the project in 2022. Current plans are to receive bids for the project in July, with construction to start in August and be complete by the end of September.

Springreen Drive Apartments Water Main Upgrades - Currently near the end of the design phase, this project includes the replacement of older, undersized water main pipe that serves the apartment buildings north of Summer Drive and between Autumn Drive and Springreen Drive. The current water main is fed from Autumn Drive and dead-ended. The new upsized water main will connect with the water main on Autumn Drive and Springreen Drive, providing a "loop" in the water main system. As of now, bidding and construction are planned for fall of 2022.

<u>Refuse Increase</u>: At the May 10th City Council meeting, it was approved to increase refuse services to \$11.50 per month. This will be effective with the July utility bill. Take Care of Outdoor Recreation Areas

City parks, trails and green spaces are available for all to use and enjoy. Your help is needed. When you use these facilities, please remember to pick up your trash and leave no trace. This way when others use the facilities after you, they will also be able to enjoy a clean environment.

Locator Flags

With construction season in full swing, you may see flags marking utilities in or around your property. Typically, flags are located either within the City right-of-way or in designated utility easements. Please do not remove these flags. The flags help the City and various utility companies locate underground wires, pipes and potential hazards to minimize utility disruption when digging occurs.

Pool and Spa Regulations

Are you thinking about adding a pool or hot tub? The City of Asbury requires the following permits: 1) Zoning – meet minimum set back requirements; 2) building – for decks and/ or other structures; 3) Electrical – for controls, heaters and pumps; 4) Fences - to meet minimum fence requirements.

Making water safety a priority is the best way to assure a safe and fun experience in a residential swimming pool or spa. It only takes inches of water for a small child to drown.

New Construction Requirements

The City requires the following permits prior to the start of a new residential home construction: a zoning permit, building permit, erosion control permit and post construction stormwater permit. Depending on the extent of the new construction permits are required for all electrical, plumbing, mechanical and excavation work.

All work is required to be inspected. For inspections, call ECIA 24 hours prior to the required inspection at 563.556.4166.

All new construction homes need to be equipped with dualsensor smoke detectors as required by the State Fire Marshal.

Cloie Creek Splash Pad

Hours of Operation: 10 am - 9 pm daily through Labor Day Address: 3031 Sanibel Lane, (located off of Park Place Drive)

The splash pad runs for five-minute cycles. After five minutes of runtime, the water will automatically shut off. To restart the flow of water, push the "activate" button located on either side of the pad. The pad will not run when it is raining.

Please help us take care of this amenity by not washing anything down the drains; such as mud, snack wrappers, or balloons, which can harm the pad's filtration system and cause the pad to be shut down for maintenance. Rinsing off bikes is strictly prohibited. Keep the fun going by helping us keep things out of the drains!
