







Meadows Golf Club recently received a long overdue clubhouse renovation to update its facility and improve the customer experience. The design was completed by **Origin Design** and construction was completed by **Conlon Construction**. The

renovation updated all areas of the current building—kitchen, bar and grill, golf shop and the event center—and added three Trackman golf simulators that are beneficial to the facility's year-round operation.

The bar and grill area is relocated upstairs and includes an expanded patio area, plenty of flat screen televisions for sporting event viewing and an updated menu with several new items (like flatbread pizzas!) We invite the public to stick around after their round of golf, watch a game or have dinner.

The golf shop has also been relocated upstairs and offers a wider variety of brands, as well as a new custom club fitting area powered by Trackman. The Trackman golf simulators are available to rent on an hourly basis, and offer over 300 courses throughout the world, as well as several golf-related games for beginners and children of all ages.


City Hall Updates

2023 ASBURY City Elections

November 7, 2023 | 7:00 am until 8:00 pm

The Asbury City Election will be held on November 7, 2023. Polls will be open from 7:00 am until 8:00 pm. Voting location for Precinct 1 is at Asbury City Hall, 5290 Grand Meadow Drive. Location for Precinct 2 is at the Dubuque County Zoning West Campus, 1225 Seippel Road. Check your voter registration card to confirm your voting location. There are two City Council seats open and the Mayor's seat open for election. Elected officials serve four-year terms.

Incumbents Robert Reisch and Curt Kiessling have filed papers to run for the open city council seats. James Adams has filed papers to run for the open Mayor's seat.

Visit the National Mississippi River Museum and Aquarium between November 10–12, 2023 and receive \$5 off your admission!



LEASHED PETS ON TRAILS

Did you know the City passed an ordinance in 2017 to allow LEASHED dogs and cats on city trails?

Any dog or cat must be leashed in designated public areas. It is unlawful for any pet owner or caretaker to allow such animal to defecate on any property not owned by the pet owner or caretaker without immediately cleaning up and disposing of the waste in a proper manner. Owners or caretakers may be fined up to \$50 for the first violation and \$100 for any subsequent violations. As a dog or cat owner, you are responsible for their actions. Aggressive or unruly pets may be directed to leave the trail, at City staff's discretion. Please keep your pets leashed and pick up after!

Snowbirds: Leaving town for the winter?

Remember to let City Hall know so that you can apply for a sewer vacancy credit! Property owners are eligible for the credit when the residential dwelling unit or commercial unit is vacant for an entirety of two months. To apply, property owners must complete the form online at cityofasbury.com/departments/sewer_vacancy_credit.

- A Sewer Vacancy Credit Form must be received from the property owner within 30 days of occupying the unit. The form is required to be signed by the property owner attesting to the information regarding dates of the vacancy.
- Payment on account must be current of most recent utility bill.
- The \$25.00 per month vacancy credit starts after the resident has vacated the property for two (2) full consecutive months.
 Maximum vacancy credit is six (6) months in a calendar year.
- The vacancy credit will be applied upon return after one to two billing cycles. Each request is reviewed and approved by the Utility Billing Clerk.

FRIENDLY WINTER REMINDERS

- Sidewalks must be cleared within 48 hours of the end of a snowfall. Check with your snow removal contractor to arrange for removal of snow during the winter months.
- Have your furnaces inspected and serviced annually. Check on any fireplaces and do not run space heaters. Make sure to test your smoke and carbon monoxide alarms, too.
- Water meters should be checked to ensure water lines are not frozen. All outdoor hoses should be drained and disconnected. Any pipes or faucets in unheated areas should be insulated.

SNOW EMERGENCIES

During snow emergencies, residents are allowed to park on the odd side of the street on odd number calendar days and on the even side of the street on even numbered calendar days from 7am until 7pm. To assist crews with snow removal, residents are encouraged to remove all vehicles from the street.

If your vehicle is found parked on the wrong side of the street during a snow emergency, it will be towed away at the owner's expense.
